LEARNING ACTIVITIES AND METHODOLOGY

Learning activities and methodology will follow the lines exposed above (competences and skills).

The class will be divided in two part: during the first part the professor will talk about the topic of the day, and she will invite the students to participate in a debate on the topic studied. The participation will be more important the days that the students will have to expose the analysis of some documents (it will be at least 2 documents to analyze during the weeks of the course.

Tutoring will take place when the students need help on the practice of the activities, when the need special or deeper explanation. A small group gathering will take place to help the students to choose and prepare the final paper topic.
