DESCRIPTION OF CONTENTS: PROGRAMME

- Making governments (work): Coalitional dynamics in fragmented environments.
- The manipulation of the electoral cycle; electoral advance and economic cycle.

LEARNING ACTIVITIES AND METHODOLOGY

- Presentations in the teacher's class with support of computer and audiovisual media, in which the main concepts of the subject are developed and the bibliography is provided to complement the students' learning.
- Critical reading of texts recommended by the teacher of the subject: Press articles, reports, manuals and / or academic articles, either for further discussion in class, or to expand and consolidate the knowledge of the subject.
