#### **OBJECTIVES**

Comptetences and skills to pose and develop an applied research in different areas of society. In depth knowledege of social sciences methodology and specifically of advanced qualitative research methods. Comptetence to choose quantitative or qualitative research methods according to the social phenomena to analyse. Students will learn to use observational methods in its different ways, in depth surveys, life histories and focus groups. They will become acquainted with specific software for qualitative data analysis like QSR.

## LEARNING ACTIVITIES AND METHODOLOGY

Weekly lectures according to syllabus and weekly different types of practical exercises: individual and in groups, written and oral or both, based on thinking and reading as well as in the observation and analysis of data. Students will work transversal competences as well as analitical, organizational and planning capacities. They will also develop their skills in information management and team work.

Collective tutorials will be offered for the supervision of observation practical exercises done in groups along several weeks.

#### ASSESSMENT SYSTEM

% end-of-term-examination/test: 40

% of continuous assessment (assignments, laboratory, practicals...): 60

Assesment along the semester is based on 10 practical exercises, as specified in the course programme, of which 9 are marked between 0,25 and 1,5 points, according to their difficulty and length. The total semester assessment adds up to 5 points.

In addition, attendance and active participation in class receives 1 point.

It is compulsory to do at least 7 of 9 assessed exercises to follow the course. The final exam has to be taken to pass.

Students can choose to be assessed only through the final which will be marked with 100% of the final
