- Attendance and participation: The regular attendance as well as the relevant participation in the context of classroom will be positively evaluated. In partircular, it is expected the active participation in the practical sessions where text or visual materials will be discussed. This participation will amount to a 20% of the final grades.
- Short papers: the student must to write three short paper (about 1000 words) answering to a proposed question related to a previous text. Capacities of understanding, and clear and sinthetic exposition will be evaluated. The value of this will amount to a 30% of the final grades.
- Final paper: The student must write a final paper about one of the topics of the matter. The student must propose previously to the teacher the main lines of the paper. The deadline will coincide with the date of the final exam. A positive evaluation in the two former points is a necessary condition to submit

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the final paper. This part will amount to a 50% of the final grade
