Unit 6. Electoral behavior in Spain. Electoral periods and electoral Spains.

## LEARNING ACTIVITIES AND METHODOLOGY

In lectures sessions the teacher will explain the main foundations of each unit. Some resources could be recomended to complete the explanation of each unit. Work in seminar sessions will deal with comparing and analyzing cases suggested by the lecturer. Some sessions will be developped in the computing laboratories. The lecturer will suggest the resources and references to be used by the students prior to each seminar sesión. Those resources will be written both in Spanish and English.
