LEARNING ACTIVITIES AND METHODOLOGY

Combination of theoretical lessons (3 ECTS) and practical cases (3 ECTS). The first will be targeted in two ways: lectures and conceptual work by students from the guidelines decided in these classes and transmitted conceptual repertoires. They will be accompanied by reading articles and discussed their historical relevance. Practical cases studies will include: analysis of signed editorials and commentaries; oral presentations by the students and argued for group discussions; development of newspaper opinion pieces in its various forms.

ASSESSMENT SYSTEM

40% of the final grade will be derived from the proper conceptual assimilation and the student's ability to apply these concepts and abstract fields of known or novel notions experience.

The remaining 60% derived from the expertise demonstrated through practical exercises in the development of argumentative newspaper articles and analysis of opinion articles.

The correct use of language will be essential to pass the course. The spelling and syntax mistakes and vocabulary poverty will be penalized at the discretion of the teacher.
