LEARNING ACTIVITIES AND METHODOLOGY

Weekly lectures on line according to syllabus and weekly presencial classes with different types of practical exercises: individual and in groups, written and oral or both, based on thinking and reading as well as in the observation and analysis of data.

Students will work transversal competences as well as analitical, organizational and planning capacities. They will also develop their skills in information management and team work.

Collective tutorials will be offered for the supervision of observation practical exercises done in groups along several weeks.

ASSESSMENT SYSTEM

Assessment along the semester is based on practical exercises, as specified in the course program, marked according their difficulty and length.

In addition, attendance and active participation in lectures is also assessed.

It is essential to pass the final exam in order to pass the course.

There is an extraordinary call for students that do not pass in the ordinary one. In this case, the grade of the continuous assessment process is kept in the event that the student had followed it, and otherwise, he/she is entitled to an exam with a value of 100% of the grade.
