Work in seminar sessions will deal with comparing and analyzing cases suggested by the lecturer. Data bases such as those from Centro de Investigaciones Sociológicas and World Values Survey will be used in the computing laboratories. The lecturer will suggest the resources and references to be used by the students prior to each seminar sesión. Those resources will be written both in Spanish and English.
