LEARNING ACTIVITIES AND METHODOLOGY

The continuous assessment system is based on a practice-oriented teaching that aims to reinforce the learning of theory through direct experience in cases that should facilitate the understanding and handling of its content.

Academic activities are divided into Lectures (large group) and Practice Sessions (small groups).

- 1. Lectures (Large Groups), in which the general lines of the subject of the corresponding topic will be presented.
- 2. Practical Sessions (Small Groups), in which specific activities are developed through which a practical vision of the content of the topics will be offered. The activities to be carried out will consist of solving practical exercises, as well as, where appropriate, other control activities such as reading the bibliography or relevant sentences and surprise tests or questions to check the level of knowledge on the topics.

ASSESSMENT SYSTEM

Each teacher may require in his group a minimum grade in the final exam to carry out the global evaluation, provided that he expressly indicates it in the global classroom at the beginning of the semester. In this case, the final grade will be the one that corresponds to apply according to the agreement of the Board of the Faculty of Social and Legal Sciences of December 16, 2014, available at the link http://e-archivo.uc3m.es/handle/10016 /21141#preview.

The global evaluation of the subject will be carried out based on the weighting of the grades obtained in the continuous evaluation activities, which is equivalent to 40% of the final grade. The final exam grade is equivalent to the remaining 60%.

Activities not carried out will be graded with a 0. The final grade obtained may be adjusted by the teacher (up to a maximum of one point) based on participation and interventions in class.

Students who do not take the final exam, either in the ordinary or extraordinary call, will appear as not presented.
