#### **TOOLS AND PLATFORMS USED FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE ACTIVITIES**

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The primary technologies used in the class were powerpoint presentations with voice along with the means of Aula Global. Each course was structured in the following way:

1. Assigned readings which were supplemented in some sessions with something to view: a news clip, an interview, etc
2. A powerpoint presentation with synced audio. These averaged approximately 50 minutes in length
3. Online discussion forum. The online discussion forum is required, and forms a students participation grade. Students respond to a prompt and to one another, multiple responses are encouraged (though only one entry is required).

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No classes were missed during the transition from in-person instruction to on-line teaching.
