

SUBJECT**JURISDICTION AND INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION**

Classroom (in person) mode

The subject Jurisdiction and International Cooperation belongs to the Basic Module (compulsory) of the Master's Degree in Criminal Law and Criminal Procedure. It has a theoretical-practical approach to the tools of international and European cooperation and its application in Spain.

The extremely positive phenomena associated with globalization in general, the abolition of border controls in the Schengen area and the free movement within the European Union have certain negative consequences, as they make borders permeable to crime, but keeping them for judicial and police authorities. Moreover, borders in cyberspace are even more insignificant, if not practically non-existent. In these circumstances, the solitary fight of each State against crime loses its effectiveness, increasing the risk of impunity.

During 12 sessions of this course, the principles of cooperation, the tools of international and European legal assistance, the main entities of judicial and police cooperation, as well as the jurisprudence in this field are discussed. Practical tasks focused on the practical application of different regulations in this field are also carried out.
