The subject Jurisdiction and International Cooperation belongs to the Basic Module (compulsory) / Specialization Module (optional) of the Master's Degree in Criminal Law and Criminal Procedure, with a theoretical-practical approach to the tools of international and European cooperation and their application in Spain.

The extremely positive phenomena associated with globalization in general, the abolition of border controls and free movement within the Schengen area have certain negative consequences, as they make the borders permeable to crime, but keeping them for the judicial and police authorities. Moreover, borders in cyberspace are even smaller, if not practically non-existent. In these circumstances, the solitary fight of each State against crime loses its effectiveness, increasing the risk of impunity.

During the two weeks of the course, the principles of cooperation, the tools of international and European legal assistance, the main entities of judicial and police cooperation, as well as the jurisprudence in this field will be analyzed.
