PRACTICAL ASPECTS OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Virtual Mode

The subject of Practical Aspects of Criminal Justice, integrated into the Basic Module (mandatory) of the Master's Degree in Criminal Law and Procedural Law, focuses on providing students with a practical understanding of the knowledge previously acquired in the field of procedural criminal law. With a duration of 6 weeks and structured into three blocks of 2 weeks each, this subject is essential within the basic procedural module. The content and activities have been designed based on real cases with the aim of motivating students in the search for and development of strategic solutions. These activities are centered on a theoretical-practical approach, allowing students to actively participate through the resolution of cases, practices, opinions, among other activities.

Additionally, the subject is complemented by 4 specialization seminars, in which experts in the field will present and discuss current topics within procedural law. Students will be able to participate in the seminars synchronously and intervene live in the debates.

The main objective of the course is for students to acquire a series of fundamental competencies, such as:

- Identifying and evaluating the impact of criminal law and procedure on fundamental and human rights.
- Recognizing the particularities of different types of criminal procedures.
- Comparing legal-criminal systems and theoretical models of investigation.
- Communicating accurately and in detail the legal qualification of specific criminal acts.
- Interpreting applicable legal and jurisprudential norms in specific cases.
- Designing procedural and substantive defense strategies.
- Representing the roles of the parties within the criminal process.
- Detecting and resolving practical problems associated with the functions performed by different legal-criminal operators.
